BEST PRACTICE IN EDUCATION ROUNDS (BPER)

These one hour presentations focus on faculty development topics and include concepts from a variety of education perspectives, linking education research with practice. They are also an accredited group learning activities as defined by the College of Family Physicians and Surgeons. BPER is co-sponsored and organized by our Centre, and The Wilson Centre. Presentations originate from St. Michael's Hospital and are video-cast to various TGA locations.
