1 MEDICAL EXPERT

1.1 Knowledge of Anatomy and Physiology Objectives:

- 1 Demonstrate understanding of the pathophysiology of common general surgery problems, e.g., colic/cholecystitis, appendicitis, bowel obstruction, and obesity.
- 2 Demonstrate understanding of abdominal and pelvic anatomy and its relevance in general surgery procedures.

1.2 Data Gathering Objectives:

- 1 Obtain a complete, systematic, and appropriate history from a patient.
- 2 Conduct a physical examination: detect important signs and know the significance.
- 3 Complete a thorough work-up including appropriate laboratory tests and imaging studies.

1.3 Clinical Reasoning, Management and Judgement/Diagnostic and Therapeutic Planning

Objectives:

- 1 Demonstrate an understanding of diagnosis and management of common general surgery problems.
- 2 Demonstrate appropriate use of Venous Thromboembolism (VTE) prophylaxis and use of prophylactic antibiotics.
- 3 Develop an approach to routine post-operative care issues, including wound care, management of drains and urinary catheters, pain management, and management of IV fluids and diet.
- 4 Manage post-operative complications, e.g., chest pains, shortness of breath, fever.
- 5 Recognize the acuity of illness of patients in the emergency room and determine the need for emergent operative intervention.
- 6 Develop an approach to the resuscitation of ill patients in the emergency room.
- 7 Review of abdominal anatomy with CT imaging studies.

1.4 Procedural Skills Objectives:

Develop competency, appropriate to level of training, in surgical skills in the following areas:

- a) Identifying instruments
- b) Prepping and draping
- c) Suturing
- d) Assisting in general surgery
- e) Opening and closing in-abdominal laparotomies
- f) Laparoscopic access including open and closed techniques
- g) Trocar placement
- h) Pneumoperitoneum
- i) Introduction to energy devices

2 COMMUNICATOR

2.1 Physician/Patient Relationship Objectives:

1 Establish therapeutic relationship with patients/families.

2.2 Verbal / Written Communication Skills Objectives:

- 1 Listen effectively, discuss appropriate information with patients/families.
