Dr. Cooper is a clinical lecturer in Obstetrics and Gynaecology at Queen Mary University. This role incorporates clinical and academic training.

Her interest in an academic career started when she worked as a research fellow at the University of Birmingham, recruiting and running a multicentre randomised controlled trial. During that time, she started her PhD in ambulatory gynaecology in which she completed in summer 2013.

She is a member of the Menstrual Disorders Clinical Study Group and has worked with the British Society for Gynaecological Endoscopy to write the RCOG Greentop guideline for best practice in outpatient hysteroscopy. She has presented her work and taught at both national and international meetings.
