1.	Demonstrate the basic scientific and clinical knowledge relevant to maternal, placental, and fetal disease, and is generally able to relate it appropriately to patient care	Medical Expert

**Other:****Procedural skills:**

- (1) Perform appropriate therapeutic maneuvers skillfully; such as vaginal delivery, operative delivery (vaginal operative or cesarean section), and twin deliveries.
- (2) Individualize surgical approach to high-risk obstetrical complications, such as placenta previa, placenta accreta, classical Cesarean sections, and cerclage.
