Gynaecology Procedural Skills – Demonstrate expertise in performing:

- (1) Laparoscopy/laparotomy: oophorectomy and ovarian cystectomies, salpingectomy / Salpingo-oophorectomy, abdominal and laparoscopic hysterectomy, abdominal myomectomy and surgical management of stage 1 and 2 endometriosis.
- (2) Vaginal hysterectomy, anterior and posterior vaginal repairs
- (3) Hysteroscopy: polypectomy, myomectomy and endometrial resection/ablation.

Obstetrics Procedural Skills – Demonstrate expertise in deliveries, including:

- (1) Vacuum and forceps assisted vaginal deliveries
- (2) Complicated perineal lacerations and episiotomy repairs
- (3) Difficult cesarean sections.
